We have trained 7 individuals to become SMART Recovery Facilitators, 4 of the individuals took an add-on training so they could facilitate SMART Recovery groups for the friends and family.

We purchased handbooks for the regular SMART Recovery groups and the Friends and Family SMART Recovery groups. These books are being given to the Recovery Coaches and the Wisconsin Certified Peer-to-Peer Support Specialists to use with their recoverees and also for group members to use if they are not able to afford the discounted cost of a handbook.

We also purchased brochures for both types of groups in order to get the information out to Probation and Parole, Dodge Co. Human Services, the alcohol and drug court, local law enforcement and other organizations and businesses.

We have provided coaching services to 2 individuals for a total of 4 hours and 30 minutes at \$32/hour to date. Most of the individuals that have been referred to us or that have requested services have had an opioid addiction and meet the requirements of our ED2Recovery grant so we have used minimal grant monies from this grant to provide coaching services.

Grant Report 2018

Crime Prevention Grant

It is our pleasure and honor to report to the Crime Prevention Board on our fall campaign and event NOT IN OUR TOWN: The Face of Trafficking in Rural Areas. This grant gift was received by 5-stones Beaver Dam, founded by Tracy Scheffler at N4834 Catbird Road, Beaver Dam, WI and hosted by Harvest EFC Church at W7444 Highway 33, Beaver Dam, WI. The grant monies were spent on a fall campaign, NOT IN OUR TOWN, during which our mission was to prime the community for our culminative event NOT IN OUR TOWN: The Face of Trafficking in Rural Areas. This campaign included two billboards, a Daily Citizen ad, an Inspire Magazine ad, posters and lawn signs throughout our community and some in surrounding areas (most were recollected and stored for repeat use in the future). It served to raise awareness of the problem of trafficking as well as to create ownership of protecting our own community, including our youth and young adults. The goal was to get a conversation started which would create an interest and curiosity that would

bring the community “to the table” for our November event. This was a successful endeavor, as we started to hear conversations in the community, some even overheard without knowledge of a 5-stones member nearby, which confirmed that people were noticing the campaign and wondering about the topic of trafficking in our area. Our team, at that time, considered moving the event from the smaller coffee-house at Harvest to the much larger worship center to accommodate a larger audience. At that time, we hoped we might be able to bring in about 200 people.

We also utilized some local free advertising options, such as a one-hour Community Comment interview, articles in The Daily Citizen and Inspire Magazine, and community event boards at LocaLeben and Daily Dodge. We were also invited to present to the Beaver Dam Council, which was a great honor for us. These opportunities served to educate as well as to inspire a community conversation and motivate people to put time aside for our culminating event on November 8.

On that date, November 8, we opened our doors at Harvest Church for NOT IN OUR TOWN: The Face of Trafficking in Rural Areas, a speaking event with keynote speaker U.S. Assistant Attorney, Julie Pfluger and a Question and Answer Panel including Dodge County District Attorney Kurt Klomberg, Beaver Dam Police Detective Heather Johnson, Survivor/Advocate Trish Propson, and Survivor/Advocate Morgan Meadows. We had an information table available as well so that attendees could walk away with relevant information to consider and learn. The attendance at this event was approximately 420 individuals! Cars were lined up into town. In attendance were Beaver Dam Mayor Glewen, the Director of 5-stones Appleton, teachers, members of the Beaver Dam Police Department, the Dodge County Sheriff’s Department for traffic control, members of other anti-trafficking groups, the medical community (20 of whom received teaching credits for attending), parents, clergy, the Clyman Coalition, and community members of all age groups (suggested 13 and up), including young adults and teenagers. Almost every seat was filled, including the worship center, the balcony, and overflow into the coffee-house where we live-streamed the event. Craig Warmbold of Good Karma WBEV/Daily Dodge was also in attendance live-streaming and recording the event. The information that was shared at this event was usable and relevant to our teens and youth in parenting, mentoring,

teaching, and volunteering. Information that was immediately action-oriented, such as checking our children's phones for specific risky apps and ways to see and notice things online and in the community will surely impact Beaver Dam to prepare and protect our wonderful town.

It would be an understatement to say that we feel the campaign and event were a success. We are still feeling the impact to the community of NOT IN OUR TOWN, including ongoing conversations as well as upcoming presentations in 2019 generated by the event. People continue to stop members of our team out in the community to express the impact of the event on their minds and hearts.

Surveys were distributed at the event on November 8 and collected upon exiting. Here is what we learned from the Surveys:

- The majority of attendees found out about the event from a **friend/family/neighbor**. After that, in order of tallies, were a church bulletin, internet (our FB, Daily Dodge, LocaLeben, etc), other associations or emails, posters, Daily Citizen, radio, grocery flyer, and lastly, Inspire magazine.
- The majority of survey-takers stated a pre-event knowledge of trafficking at **1**, with the largest range between 1 and 3 (on a scale of 0-5, with 0 being no knowledge and 5 being full knowledge). The majority of survey-takers stated a post-event knowledge of trafficking at **4**, with the largest range between 3 and 4.
- Sampling of Anecdotal Comments noted on survey (positive and negative included) in response to the most important thing you learned at the event and additional comments:
 - "Great panel of speakers!! Many useful pieces of information."
 - "The saddest thing was the apparent lack of help for the victim through the court system."
 - "The broad scope of the whole situation."
 - "What about boys?"
 - "I think the most important thing is that it's happening and frequently. Great presentation and turn out tonight! Way to make a difference!"
 - "internet use by kids- be aware"

- "It's in my backyard. Thank you! Great presentation!"
- "to be aware of people around you, have open ears to hear what people have to say. I'm a teacher of 3rd and 4th graders and it has opened my eyes to really pay attention to what their conversations are about."
- "strategies that traffickers use, prosecution and the law, victims and their coercion"
- "This issue continually needs to be presented for education. Community recognizes the issue."
- "How much this event has brought people together for change."
- "Don't be afraid to report something suspicious."
- "No court ordered services for victim"
- "We all need to do something"
- "It can happen to anyone. Excellent! Learned a lot!"
- "I believe it's important to not always refer to the victim as her/she...important for people to be aware this can also happen to males."
- "here, we're largely dealing with pimps controlling 4-6 women; that's the major shape of it in Dodge County."
- "How prevalent social media/gaming can be and seeing/hearing real stories happening here"
- "If I see something, Do something"
- "talk to our kids-no judgement zone"
- "that sex trafficking is everywhere and victims are vulnerable or in vulnerable situations, and we should be aware of those around us. Excellent speakers and info."
- "That it is in our little towns."
- "There is help out there."
- "Sex trafficking is everywhere and where you least expect it."
- "It is much more prevalent in our community than I realized. Very informative event!"
- "Success stories about justice being served"
- "How to protect children! What kids need!"

- “Keep your eyes and ears out and be willing to talk to especially kids and willing to help them get help. Male and female. Don’t be afraid to report anything you feel is important.”
- “About 5-stones and resources available regarding human trafficking”
- “What is all involved in trafficking and ideas to prevent it or look for as a parent. Develop the safety plan”
- “The large group here shows a great desire to learn of sex-trafficking and how can we help.”
- “Be aware. Talk to your kids.”
- “The signs you should look for if you are concerned about someone”
- “Be aware. Monitor activities.”
- “I liked hearing the experiences and stories of the survivors.”
- “Protect all children. Thank you for this very informative presentation.”
- “There are many games and social media that is used to start capturing youth with porn.”
- “The panel did a great job; was surprised to hear it is in our town. Keep having these meetings.”
- “Listen-open communication. Keep track of what your children are doing.”
- “We must make a difference.”
- “How traffickers coerce children and who they are looking for.”
- “Be observant and look for signs in my workplace and community. It happens here.”
- “I learned that there are websites that people use to traffic people.”
- “To be aware of kids in my life and what they think. Be a safe person.”
- “This can happen anywhere. I need to be vigilant with my child.”
- “Report what you see.”
- “Trafficking is happening in our town and be aware and report to the authorities for any suspicious people.”
- “Be aware and be involved in your child/grandchild’s life. Monitor internet activity.”
- “Learn more, be aware, check out my grandkid’s apps.”

- “The possible dangers of video games was a total shock.”
- “How to further identify sex trafficking and what we can do to fight it.”
- “...the process of prosecution.”
